



Surprise Meat inspection drives on the eve of Eid-ul-fiter

On the directions of Commissioner, JMC, Mr. Rahul Yadav, IAS, a joint team of Jammu Municipal Corporation and Doctors deputed by Sheep Husbandry Department viz. Dr. Ramandeep Singh, Dr. Jiwan Lal & Dr. Gishali Khullar along with Municipal Veterinary Officer, Dr. Divya Sharma, conducted various surprise Meat inspection drives on the eve of Eid-ul-fiter 2024 in different areas of Jammu City to ensure the sale of wholesome, good quality meat and meat byproducts to the consumers. The surprise drives were conducted in Talab Tillo, Bohri, Muthi, Bantalab, Paloura, Janipur, Ambphalla, CPO chowk, Narwal, Gandhi Nagar, Gangyal, Satwari, Talab Khatikan & Shahidi Chowk etc.

During the drives, various meat shops, chicken shops & fish mongers were inspected and about 25 Kg of substandard meat was seized and later on disposed off scientifically. Also a fine to the tune of Rs. 10,000/- was imposed to the meat sellers for selling unstamped, unhygienic & substandard meat.

Meat & chicken shop vendors were also instructed to keep separate bins to collect the daily waste generated on account of refused/inedible meat & chicken parts for further proper disposal through JMC vehicles.

MVO, JMC, Dr. Divya Sharma also sensitize all the shopkeepers/ Vendors dealing with meat/chicken products to maintain hygienic environment in and around their shops and adhere with the various provisions of Food Safety Act, 2006, Municipal Corporation Act, 2000 and other directions & guidelines issued by the JMC from time to time so that good quality hygienic meat shall reach to the consumers.

H&UDD, J&K Hosts Training cum interactive session on Water Bodies Rejuvenation: Experts Share Insights and Best Practices.

Today, a one-day training cum interactive session was held at the conference hall of the Jammu Municipal Corporation (JMC) under the Guidance of Ms. Mandeep Kaur, IAS Commissioner/Secretary, H&UDD, J&K. The session was conducted by Mr. Anand Malligavad, a Water Bodies Rejuvenation Expert from the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA). To make our cities more live able, sustainable and water secure in the long run, the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA), Government of India, has included rejuvenation of water bodies and creation of green spaces as one of major project component of the flagship scheme of Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT)-2.0 covering.

The training program, attended by engineering staff from JMC and other urban local bodies of (ULBs) Jammu including Kathua, Rajouri, Samba, and Udhampur, focused on the crucial task of rejuvenating water bodies across the region. Mr. Malligavad, drawing from his expertise and experience, provided insights into the complete process of lake rejuvenation, ranging from the identification of lakes requiring rejuvenation to the execution of revitalization strategies.

During the session, Mr. Malligavad shared valuable experiences from various states, highlighting successful case studies such as the rejuvenation of lakes in Bengaluru. Attendees had the opportunity to learn firsthand from these experiences and apply best practices to their respective areas, followed by visit of Tawi River front and pilot project of pond rejuvenation of ward No. 55.

Among the distinguished attendees were the Mr. Narinder Khajuria, Mission Director (AMRUT)-2.0, Mr. Puneet Sharma, (JKAS) Director of Urban Local Bodies Jammu, Mr. Abdul Star, (JKAS) Joint Commissioner (Health and Sanitation) of JMC, Officers of different department like UEED, PHE, Flood control etc., Executive Officers of concerned ULBs, and all engineering staff from the respective ULBs. Their active participation demonstrated a collective commitment to enhancing water conservation and environmental sustainability efforts in the region.
